TREASURER'S REPORT:

STANDING COMMITTEES:

Patrol:

Chairman Stahl reported on behalf of the LHAMP. DEEP has advised that the officers cannot attempt to stop and check vessels at the dock prior to launching. Patrols are complete for the season with the exception of the upcoming regatta October 6^{th} .

Water Quality

Paul Jacobson reported that he contacted the Shelton town engineer Bob Kulacz and discussed the storm water management plan. Mr. Kulacz was receptive to working with the LHA and offered to attend an upcoming meeting in either November or January to discuss the program.

Weed Abatement:

Jim Olson reported that a second survey would take place at the end of the season to verify results. Mr. Olson believes Lake Zoar's practice of a second treatment in August may be a possible contributing factor to blue green algae. There was an article in the Ct Post September 9th stating lack of wind has contributed to water quality issues as well as an article in Republican American September 18th in regards to blue green algae.

Vessels and Equipment:

The harvester manufacturer has offered to sell the harvester on consignment should the LHA decide to do so. The board agreed it was premature to consider selling it at this time but the harvester will remain out of service as chemical weed abatement and other options are explored further. The patrol boats will be pulled to be cleaned. They will be returned to the water for one day for the October 6th regatta and then pulled for winterizing and shrink wrap.

OLD BUSINESS:

Water Draw Down

The board continued to discuss the issues with the unscheduled water draw down. Under consideration is setting aside the 2nd week of May with a rain date of 3rd week of May for drawdown. Hopkins has indicated they will not be negatively affected by the draw down date. The next draw down is scheduled for October 9th for one day only.
